

Instruction Guide:

Mercury Instant Messenger (IM)

Version 1.0 for the Nokia 9210 / 9290 Communicator™

Midletsoft would like to thank you for purchasing Mercury Instant Messenger (IM) for the Nokia 9210 / 9290 Communicator. What follows below are comprehensive instructions for application deployment and use.

Installing Mercury Instant Messenger (IM):

Please see the instruction guide for your Nokia 9210 / 9290 Communicator for the proper application installation procedures.

Note: The Java run-time environment must be installed onto your Communicator for this application to work. Please see <http://www.nokia.com/> for more details about installing the Java run-time environment.

Using Mercury Instant Messenger (IM):

Now that you should have successfully installed our application onto your device, let us walk you through deployment procedures.

Note: When you start the application, you will initially see our application splash screen with the words “Midletsoft presents,” a statue of Mercury, etc... It’s working!

Logging in:

Once you pass the splash screen, you will initially be prompted to log in. If you have already created an account on a public Jabber server, then you may login by entering in your correct credentials. If you haven’t yet created an account, you’ll have to register for a user account first.

Create New Account

In order to create a new account, you must open the menu bar, and select **Control > Create New Account**. Here you will be prompted to enter:

- Username:
- Password:
- Server:

Type in a unique “Username” and “Password.” For the server, we recommend you enter “njs.netlab.cz.” However, if you know of another public Jabber server you would rather use, enter in its information instead. Select OK.

Note: You can find a list of alternative public Jabber servers with various functioning third party gateways at <http://www.jabberview.com>

You should now see the words “logged in” on the bottom status bar on the main page. You are now connected to a Jabber server, and you are ready to chat!

Adding Contacts

Your buddy list is now displayed, but if this is your first time registering to a server, you don’t have any buddies. It is time to add them. To add a buddy, do the following:

1. Open the “Control” menu.
2. Now, select “Add Contact.”
3. If you know a buddy’s user name, type it in – otherwise you can add Midletsoft to your list of buddies: “midletsoft.” (Note: You must enter in a contact who also has a Jabber ID – to add third party IM user buddies, please see the Adding Gateways section below)

4. You should enter in the contact like this:
JabberID@jabberserver.com/org/etc.... *For example:*
midletsoft@jabber.com
5. Enter in the "Nickname" you want to see in your contact list.

After this is done, select "Add." This new buddy should now be "pending." Once they log on and accept your request, you will be able to check their online status. (Offline / Online)

Chatting

You can send messages to buddies when they are online or offline.

Select the buddy you want to send a message, and then select "Write Message." The text window will open up, and you can enter in your message. When you are done writing your message, select "OK" and your message will be sent.

Your sent message should now appear in the main chat area. When someone sends you a message, it will also appear in the same area. To send another message, select someone in your contact contact, and then click "Write Message."

Groupchat Function

Mercury IM is not only a messenger for one-to-one communication; it is also a powerful tool to initiate groupchat sessions with friends and clients.

To start a groupchat session, you must first create a groupchat session room. Please select **Conferencing > Join/Create Room** from the main toolbar. Give your room a unique name, and select the local server as the host for the groupchat session. When this is done, click "OK." You should see in the status bar that you are now in your named groupchat room. Please select **Conferencing > Room ID** if you are not sure if you are in your room or not.

Once you start your own groupchat session, you will need to invite your contacts into it! Select a contact in the contact list to invite, and

then select **Conferencing > Invite To Room** from the main toolbar. This will send the select user a groupchat session invitation. If they accept your invitation, they will appear in your contact list with the prefix *group_userID*. For example, a normal user may be listed as *user2* in your contact list, but when they are also in your groupchat session, they will be listed as *group_user2* in your contact list.

To send a message to everyone in the groupchat session, select the *group_everyone* contact in the contact list. If you wish to send private messages in a groupchat session, select the individual user in the groupchat session.

Adding Gateways

A gateway allows you to utilize third party IM services such as AOL, MSN, Yahoo!, etc... When you register for an account on a Jabber server, that specific server will have certain third party IM chat capabilities, depending on what the server administrator has installed. To find out what third party gateways are available, you will have to complete the following:

Go to the menu and select **Gateways > Add Gateway**. When this is selected, all available gateway names will appear. If you have username/password credentials already for one of those gateways, go ahead and fill in the "Username" and "Password" fields and add the gateway if you wish. If you do not have credentials for a listed gateway, you will need to go to the respective IM service web page, and sign up for an IM user account. If you don't have an account with these IM services, you cannot add their respective gateway to your Jabber account nor can you chat with users from those third party services.

After a gateway has been added, you can check the status of a gateway by selecting **Gateway > Registered Gateways** in the main toolbar. Only registered gateways will be displayed. If a gateway has been successfully added, you'll now be able to chat with members of that IM service. If you go to your buddy list, any buddies you had on

that third party IM service should now be listed once you have logged out and logged back into the Jabber server.

Menu

The rest of the menu items are pretty self-explanatory. You can remove contacts you do not want on your list (once they are removed, they can not contact you), add new contacts, edit contact information, and log out (so someone else can log back in and check their Jabber account).
